Framework for Service Authorisations

The Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) recently released a Consultation Paper on the 'Framework for Service Authorisations to be Granted Under the Telecommunications Act, 2023.' These authorisations are dealt with (inter alia) under Chapter II of the Telecommunications Act, 2023, and are required to be obtained in order to legally "establish, operate, maintain or expand" telecommunication networks, including satellite and submarine networks, or "provide telecommunication services."....read more
